B. Pursuant to Section 32-1-903(5), C.R.S., "location" means the physical, telephonic, electronic, or virtual place, or a combination of such means where a meeting can be attended. "Meeting" has the same meaning as set forth in Section 24-6-402(1)(b), C.R.S., and means any kind of gathering, convened to discuss public business, in person, by telephone, electronically, or by other means of communication.

C. Pursuant to Section 24-6-402(2)(c)(I), C.R.S., special districts are required to designate annually at the board of directors of the district's first regular meeting of each calendar year, the public place at which notice of the date, time and location of regular and special meetings ("**Notice of Meeting**") will be physically posted at least 24 hours prior to each meeting ("**Designated Public Place**"). A special district is deemed to have given full and timely notice of a regular or special meeting if it posts its Notice of Meeting at the Designated Public Place at least 24 hours prior to the meeting.

D. Pursuant to Section 24-6-402(2)(c)(III), C.R.S., special districts are relieved of the requirement to post the Notice of Meeting at the Designated Public Place, and are deemed to have given full and timely notice of a public meeting if a special district posts the Notice of Meeting online on a public website of the special district ("**District Website**") at least 24 hours prior to each regular and special meeting.

E. Pursuant to Section 24-6-402(2)(c)(III), C.R.S., if a special district is unable to post a Notice of Meeting on the District Website at least 24 hours prior to the meeting due to exigent or emergency circumstances, then it must physically post the Notice of Meeting at the Designated Public Place at least 24 hours prior to the meeting.

F. Pursuant to Section 32-1-903(1.5), C.R.S., all meetings of the board that are held solely at physical locations must be held at physical locations that are within the boundaries of the district or that are within the boundaries of any county in which the district is located, in whole or in part, or in any county so long as the physical location does not exceed twenty (20) miles from the district boundaries unless such provision is waived.

G. The provisions of Section 32-1-903(1.5), C.R.S., may be waived if: (1) the proposed change of the physical location of a meeting of the board appears on the agenda of a meeting; and (2) a resolution is adopted by the board stating the reason for which meetings of the board are to be held in a physical location other than under Section 32-1-903(1.5), C.R.S., and further stating the date, time and physical location of such meeting.

TERMINATION AND RELEASE OF STREETSCAPE AND EASEMENT AGREEMENTS

This Termination and Release of Streetscape and Easement Agreements ("Termination Agreement") is made and entered into this ______ day of ______, 2022 between The Serenity Ridge Metropolitan District No. 1, a quasi-municipal corporation and political subdivision of the State of Colorado ("District No. 1") and the Serenity Ridge Owners Association, a Colorado non-profit corporation ("Association"), each individually a "Party" and collectively, the "Parties."

RECITALS

WHEREAS, the Association is a Colorado non-profit corporation charged with certain duties of management, maintenance, and care of the common interest community located Arapahoe County, Colorado and is the association named and referred to in the Declaration of Covenants, Conditions, Easements and Restrictions for Serenity Ridge recorded with the Arapahoe County Clerk and Recorder on July 25, 2004 at Reception Number B4114570;

WHEREAS, District No. 1 is the managing district responsible for administering the provision of public improvements by the Serenity Ridge Metropolitan District Nos. 1 and Nos. 2;

WHEREAS, District No. 1 is the owner of a certain tracts of real property located within the service area of District No. 1 and/or the service areas of District 2 as more particular described on the attached <u>Exhibit A</u>;

WHEREAS, the Parties entered into a Streetscape Agreement on February 16, 2010, which is attached hereto as <u>Exhibit B</u>, regarding the real property described on the attached <u>Exhibit A</u>;

WHEREAS, the Streetscape Agreement granted the Association a non-exclusive easement on, over, and across the real property ("the Easement") as more particularly described in Exhibit B.

WHEREAS, the Streetscape Agreement permitted termination of the Streetscape Agreement and the Easement incorporated therein by the Association for any reason;

WHEREAS, the Association has provided notice of termination of the Streetscape Agreement and the Easement to District No. 1 prior to September 1, 2022 in compliance with the Streetscape Agreement and Easement; and

WHEREAS, Section 4 of the Streetscape Agreement requires the Parties execute and record a termination agreement memorializing the Association's termination of the Streetscape Agreement and the Easement.

NOW, THEREFORE, pursuant to the Streetscape Agreement and in consideration of the foregoing, the Parties agree as follows:

1. The Streetscape Agreement between the Parties and all rights and obligations therein are hereby terminated and released in all respects effective April 1, 2023.

2. Upon the effective date of April 1, 2023, District No. 1 shall retain ownership of the Tracts of real property described in <u>Exhibit A</u> and all improvements located thereon which were subject to the Streetscape Agreement. The maintenance, repair and replacement of the Tracts of real property described in Exhibit A and all improvements located thereon shall be the responsibility of District No. 1 at its sole cost and expense.

3. Upon the effective date of April 1, 2023, the Easement granted to the Association as reflected in Exhibit B is terminated. The Association releases all rights and interests in the Tracts described in Exhibit A or any improvements located thereon and the Easement shall be null, void, and no longer of any further force or effect.
